



**PROJECT AWARENESS AND SPECIAL SPORTS (PAASS)**  
**CODE OF CONDUCT FOR PARENTS, FAMILY MEMBERS, AND GUESTS**

PAASS has adopted the following Code of Conduct for all parents. Parents should read, understand and sign off on this form before registering their children to participate in this program.

Any parent violating the Code of Conduct at a game or practice will be asked to leave the sports facility and will not be allowed to attend the next game. Repeat violations may cause multiple-game or full-season suspensions.

The participants must learn to be gracious winners and losers, understanding that “how the team played” is much more important than the score.

Parents play an important role in our program and are expected to abide by its mission. By signing off on this form, all parents agree to:

- 1.) Exemplify good sportsmanship at all times, teaching your child that doing one’s best is more important than winning, so that each child will never feel defeated by the outcome of a game or his/her performance.
- 2.) Recognize the importance of and value of coaches who volunteer countless hours of their time to teach and lead the team. Without the coach volunteers, there would be no Challenger program.
- 3.) If you have concerns about your child or the team, you will communicate directly with the coach in a positive manner. This communication must not occur immediately before or after a game and must be done privately. DB Challenger has a minimum play rule for all participants to ensure game action for all players.
- 4.) Respect the officials and their authority during games. Never question, complain or argue with a referee’s judgment call. Never use profanity, yell or gesture in an inappropriate way during a game or practice.
- 5.) Refrain from coaching or directing players during the game. Applaud good plays by your team and by members of the opposing team. Never ridicule or shout at your child or other players for making mistakes.
- 6.) Encourage your child to practice in order to improve his or her skill level. Ensure that players are on time to every game and practice.

This Code of Conduct is not all inclusive. Parents should understand and abide by the spirit of the code as well. Any complaints regarding parent behavior must first be directed to the league commissioner and then to the Athletic Director for a final decision.
